commercial breeding operations.

🐾 Every time an animal is adopted from one of our shelters, it makes room for another animal in need. The sooner we place animals into permanent homes, the better for all the animals. Our staff and volunteers also say thank you, thank you, thank you a lot.

🐾 BC SPCA shelters adhere to high standards of animal welfare, however, no shelter environment can duplicate the comfort and stability of someone’s home. The sooner an animal is rehomed, the better. We also like to see their tails wag as they leave.

🐾 We save precious donor dollars by adopting out animals as soon as we can. These funds can then go toward our mission work, which includes providing spay/neuter programs, rescuing animals,

enforcing animal cruelty laws and delivering humane education.
